The Public Safety Building **CANNOT** accept:

BATTERIES

Lithium, Lithium Ion, Lead Acid, and Wet Cell batteries, damaged and/or leaking batteries`

FLORESCENT BULBS

HID, broken bulbs, UV lamps and CFLs

The City of Springfield now offers a RedMed Box for unused medications in pill form.

The RedMed Box can accept:

- Expired/ Unwanted prescription medication in pill form
- Over the counter medications in pill form
- Medication samples in pill form
- pet medication in pill form

The RedMed Box CANNOT accept:

- medicated ointments, lotions or drops
 - unopened epi-pens
 - liquid medications
 - needles, lancets, syringes, or other "sharps"
 - thermometers
 - IV bags
 - inhalers
 - bloody or infectious waste
 - hydrogen peroxide
 - business waste (nursing or group homes)
 - empty containers
 - personal care products (shampoos, etc.)
